## **GAYTON NEWS - WINTER 2023**



Christmas Bin collections. Due to Christmas Day falling on a Monday this year and Boxing Day on a Tuesday, Gayton's black bins will be emptied on Saturday 23 December instead of Tuesday 27 December. Please leave your bin and food caddy out by 6.30am on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> December. Garden waste. Those subscribed to the service are advised there will be a short break in collections from 23 December until 5 January. Christmas Tree collections. Crews will collect real Christmas trees between 8 and 19 January. You don't have to have a garden waste (green bin) subscription for us to take real trees away. Put them out on the day garden waste (green/blue bin) is due to be collected. Food waste. Food waste bins will continue to be collected on their usual weekly schedule. Please remember you can recycle leftover raw and cooked foods, including veg peelings, egg shells, out-of-date food, plate scrapings, solid fats, meat and fish bones. Do not put any liquids in the caddy. Additional recycling. Additional recycling can be put out in clear plastic bags or boxes alongside recycling bins and boxes, or can be taken to the nearest Household Waste Recycling Centre.



**Report fly-tipping**. Fly-tipping is the illegal disposal of waste and is a criminal offence that can carry a sentence of 5 years' imprisonment and a fine. It is an eyesore, it is degrading to communities, it causes pollution, it creates a danger to people and wildflie, it costs tax payers in Northamptonshire over £750,000 to deal with every year.

WNC have the power to issue on-the-spot fines for fly-tipping, and to seize vehicles which have been used in fly-tipping. The Fixed Penalty Notice for fly-tipping is £400. Please 'Report fly-tipping'. If you witness waste being illegally dumped in West Northants it is vital you report it to us so we can remove the rubbish and take action against the offender, where possible. www.westnorthants.gov.uk/street-cleansing/report-fly-tipping

**Report Blocked Gullies.** West Northants Council confirms that all gullies are cleansed on a routine cleansing cycle. The period in which these are cleansed depends on the area. In Gayton these are cleansed on a 2-yearly basis, with the last cleanse being in 2022. The next cleanse cycle for Gayton will be roughly October 2024. Gayton Parish Councillor Roger Clarke is the nominated Councillor for Gullies/Drains/Highways within the village. You will be able to pin point the particular gully that is causing the issue and will be kept up to date with any actions as the report is updated. Gayton continues to suffer from irresponsible dog owners who do not clean up after their dogs.

There are continued reports of dog fouling on streets in the village. In the past couple of weeks there has been dog fouling in the children's play area and on the green, where children play.

Gayton Parish Council have provided dog bins around the village to make it easy to dispose of dog mess. You can also dispose of this in your black bin at home.

#### There is no excuse to leave it. Please clean it up and bin it.

Dog fouling and the LAW. Dog mess is the most unacceptable and offensive type of litter on our streets. Research tells us that dog fouling is the issue the public are most concerned about.

Dog fouling is not only deeply unpleasant, it is dangerous. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizures.

While most dog owners are caring, responsible individuals, there are still some people who do not clean up after their pets.

Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £100. If the case goes to court this could cost the owner or person in charge of the animal £1,000. The law states that being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse.

### **Childrens Play Area**

I have received several reports of the gates to the children's play area being left open, being wedged open, as well as the report of dog fouling in the play area.

It is essential that the gates to the children's play area are kept closed, for children's safety and to keep dogs out. Dogs are not permitted in the play area.

Please educate your children to close the gates when they enter and when they leave the play area. Thank you.

# **Gayton and Tiffield Community Minibus**

Our extended service to cover Eastcote, Dalscote, Pattishall and Astcote has been running since June and we are now getting more passengers on the bus. The small extra journey time does not appear to be important as passengers are already on the bus in the warm and dry.



Our current timetable is on the back cover. Please note that both the Tuesday and Friday services are now the same with the bus leaving Gayton as before at 9:30 but then going through the other villages to Towcester, and then on to Northampton (<u>if requested when getting on</u>). The bus will then return to collect from Towcester, drop off passengers in the villages and then collect anyone from Northampton. This will allow about an hour each in Towcester and Northampton.

If you have any comments to make about the service please contact me.

West Northamptonshire have continued to support us with grant funding at the same level as last year (not inflation linked!) which is an important source of income for us, as well as our fares (both cash and refunded concessionary ones) and private hire.

The grants we gratefully received from both Gayton and Tiffield Parish Councils have now been used for training all of our nine volunteer drivers to obtain minibus MiDAS licences (which are a legal requirement).

Our new drivers, Pete Baxter and John Rogers from Gayton, seem to be enjoying driving, so with our new state of the art, air conditioned minibus and the increase in our service area to hopefully draw in extra funding, the future at the moment is looking good.

Thanks go to team of nine dedicated drivers which also includes Manja and Jens from Gayton and to our Trustees who run things behind the scenes.

Please remember that we are a charity and it is a community bus, so if you want to hire a 16 seater (plus driver) for trips out, airport runs, sports or social events please contact us to see if we are available. Recent trips have been to local pubs and restaurants, airport runs, monthly dining club visits and regular darts team away matches.

The aim was to raise enough money to install a defibrillator at the Eykyn arms, giving the village a second one.

Martyn, Les, Ronnie, Tom, Peter, Gavin, Tony, Karl, Rich, Nathan, Eamon, Mark, Brian, Paul and Pete left Gayton on the 16th of September and were joined by Paul and Iestyn over the weekend.

They travelled to Amsterdam, on the 17th we travelled to Cologne, the 18th to Luxembourg, the 19th to Strasbourg, the 20th to Riems, the 21st to Brussels and travelled back to Gayton on the 22<sup>nd</sup> September.

The aim was to do it in as cheap a car as possible, use the least amount of fuel and travel the least amount of miles.









In all they managed to raise £1781 through amazing donations made by people in the village and surrounding areas with the crowd funding put on Gayton village page, from which they completed the install of the new defibrillator at The Eykyn Arms (Thanks to Karen and John for allowing this). The Gumballers will raise funds for its maintenance.





A massive thank you to everyone who helped make this happen.

They have been very lucky, and have received a donation of another defibrillator, which they will buy a cabinet for. Gayton Church have voted and have agreed it's a great idea to locate it at the Church, and a great resource for the village, so hopefully it shouldn't be long.
