

Winter Fuel Payment

This **will no longer be paid automatically to all pensioners**, only to those receiving Pension Credit payments. Over 800,000 people are entitled to this payment but do not claim it.

The following websites provide a way of checking whether you are eligible for Pension Credit:

Gov.uk Pension Credit calculator Turn2us benefits calculator Entitledto.co.uk

If you are eligible, you need to **apply by 21 December 2024** to receive the winter fuel payment for this winter.

To apply by post, <u>print out and fill in the Pension</u> <u>Credit claim form</u> or call the claim line to request a form.

Do not write anything except the freepost address on the envelope. You do not need a postcode or a stamp.

Contact a voluntary organisation like <u>Citizens</u> <u>Advice</u> or <u>Age UK</u> if you need help with the form.

A Half Century for Saint Mary's Court



"The Beaufort"

The history of the old Gayton House has been expertly related by Rita Poxon previously here in the Gayton News. It was demolished in the early 1970s and 12 new houses were built in its grounds - Saint Mary's Court (SMC). (Ed. - Ranging in price from £17,500 to £22,250!) The developers, Sir John Palmer and Lady Palmer also built a new Gayton House for themselves close to the old site, but separate from SMC.

From 1973 Advert - "The properties... include Three "Campbell" types and nine "Beauforts." The Beaufort, which costs from £20,500, has four bedrooms, two bathrooms – one ensuite, *lounge, dining room, study, cloakroom utility and double garage"*

All that remains of the old Gayton House is the grand entrance at the bottom of Baker Street, with its famous Chinese lanterns, designed by Clough Williams-Ellis, (born in Gayton and famous for building Portmeirion). Also; the stone boundary wall that runs along Springs Orchard, Blisworth Road and Harris Lane, plus, a number of very old and large specimen trees planted by the owners of the old Gayton House in the 19th century.

SMC was completed early 1974 so it has notched up a half century and the Gayton News editor, an SMC resident, has suggested this milestone should be marked by an article about its history. He invited me, as one of the few remaining original residents, to pen a few words on the subject.

Wendy and I moved into number 12 in February 1974. We were in our 30's and our children were 4 and 5. Within a few months,

all 12 houses were occupied and many of the families were similar to ourselves in age and some had children of around the same age as ours. So we had much in common. Through the week, we worked hard to pay off the mortgage and at the weekend, we still had bags of energy to play hard and socialise.

It didn't take long for the young vibrant residents of SMC to gel into a close knit community. We became friends, we helped each other out, we shared transport, and we organised many events - outings to restaurants, concerts etc., and parties within the Court.

Particularly memorable were our New Year's Eve celebrations. Because of our young children, we couldn't go out, so every year we organised a Safari Dinner Party. It involved visiting several houses and at each one we played a game and consumed a dish (starter, main course, dessert,) accompanied by a good choice of drinks. We started early evening and finished in the not so early hours of New Year's Day.

The games took place in back gardens or out in the road and involved a wide variety of equipment. They were all very amusing to watch and often very testing to perform.

Gayton and Tiffield Community Minibus

Hi Everyone,

Since the previous newsletter outlining our funding problems, we have kindly received some financial support from both the Gayton Alms Charities (Poor's Estate) and the Tiffield Poor's Allotment Charity for which we are very grateful. This does not make up for the WNC shortfall but does allow us to bid for other funds on a match-funding basis. Since expanding the service to Eastcote, Pattishall and Astcote passenger numbers have increased and these now make up more than half of our regular users. At the moment we are continuing with this service for the foreseeable future. We do realise that it means a slightly longer journey for Gayton residents but we do need the extra fares to keep the service operating.

Most users seem happy with the current timetable but I recently had a request for a longer time to be available for those wishing to go to Towcester or Northampton for social reasons. This is possible with the existing timetable as we can drop you in Towcester at 10:05 and then pick you up after the bus returns to Gayton with a minor detour when en-route to Northampton just before 12 noon. Similarly, if you want to stay longer in Northampton then just discuss this with the driver and the return time can be adjusted to suit you, (as long as it is not too late!). This is a Community Bus Service so we do try to respond to everyone's wishes but if you would like to comment on the service please contact me.

The government's fare cap for <u>cash</u> customers of <u>£2 per single journey</u> we assume will last until the end of December 2024 but it may be reviewed in the new government's Autumn Statement/Budget. <u>Passengers with bus</u> passes do not have to pay anything.



Thanks again to our team of nine dedicated drivers and to our Trustees who run things behind the scenes.

Please remember that we are a charity and it is a community bus, so if you want to hire a 16 seater (plus driver) for trips out, airport runs, sports, or social events please contact us to see if we are available. Recent trips have been to local pubs and restaurants, airport runs, monthly dining club visits and regular darts team away matches. **Donations are always** welcome.

In addition, do not forget that our wonderful local farming families do a lot to keep the routes clear and the hedges tidy, sometimes as part of the Gov't schemes, (to which there are restrictions) but often out of the goodness of their hearts, so Thank You very much!

In particular thank you for the invaluable help from Clive in cutting back the Ivy Hedge on Fiveways to assist us in clearing the path, which we discovered was actually twice as wide as we thought!and we even recovered a "lost" set of keys......!

And many thanks to Cameron for borrowing a "Chopper" (which I presume is a "Big Boys Toy" attachment to his Tractor!) and cutting RL2, leading from Park Lane, making the rest of the job much easier for us!

Also, please note that if you have volunteered for Roger Clarke's excellent "Adopt a Sign" scheme, do not be afraid to ask for assistance for difficult jobs or loan of Hi-Viz vests if you are working near the Highway.

In August, I led a 4.3-mile mostly flat walk around Bucknell Wood in search of Butterflies. I'm no expert, but we hoped to see: Wood White, Purple Hairstreak, Whiteletter Hairstreak, Purple Emperor, White Admiral, Silver-washed Fritillary, but all we saw was a stranded off-Road Motor biker!!

We retired afterwards to The New Inn, Abthorpe for a pint. This lovely pub is the hub of the community, providing excellent beer from Hook Norton brewery and locally produced food. (Currently, Northants CAMRA Rural Pub of the Year 2024!)
