From the Rector

As I write this it is cold outside but, the sun is shining brightly and it is so easy to forget the grey, damp, rainy days we've been experiencing for so long recently and which make us feel so downhearted and miserable.



We are coming up to the season of Lent in the Christian calendar, the time when we remember Jesus spending a fairly long period of time alone in the desert region. Whilst not subject to the vagaries of the British weather, Jesus had his own weather problems in that desert - scorching hot days and freezing cold nights. And, no supermarket or convenience store to pop into for a bottle of water or a hot coffee or a snack bar!

Paul and I have visited that desert area and know for ourselves what the conditions are like (and we had water and snacks with us plus extra warm clothing). There are the occasional caves for shelter but the shifting sand and the wind which blows the sand around make orientation very difficult, not to mention the scorching sun relentless every day and no factor 50! Imagine being out there alone for a day let alone a few weeks. No wonder Jesus was famished and probably dehydrated and victim of hallucinations at the end of it.

But, that period alone with God was just what Jesus needed before he really began his public ministry - time out! And it is just the same for us. We may not literally be in a desert but it can feel as if we are alone, in a desert that everything is conspiring against us to make life difficult. It is at times like these that we ask God to draw close to us; to revive us, to support us and give us the strength to carry on.

Yes, we do have to acknowledge our own faults and failings (other people are not usually the source of many of our problems) but God is a very forgiving God if we admit we are sorry for our wrongdoings, ask for His forgiveness and be determined to do our best not to make the same mistakes again.

That is Lent! And, what follows Lent? - the joy of Easter, and that's another story.

A Neighbourhood Development Plan

April 26 – a Date for Your Diary

There will be a Village Meeting on Saturday 26th April (time to be announced) to explain why we are asking Residents to fill in a questionnaire about the future of the Parish.

The questionnaire is really important as the views of the residents must be at the heart of our Neighbourhood Development Plan.

Your feedback will allow us to understand where you think new houses, businesses and other amenities should go and what they will look like. It will also give you the opportunity to have your say on things you think important that fall outside the scope of the Development Plan.

During the meeting, you will be introduced to the team from Gayton that is leading the project. You will also meet Henry Spurrier the local landowner and Ed Dixon his advisor who will give a short presentation about their plans for the future of the Gayton Estate.

The team will explain how to fill in the questionnaire, preferably online as it is easier to compile the results but also in hard copy for those who prefer pen and paper. We will also explain where to drop off completed hard copy questionnaires once completed.

Questions will be invited from the floor so, if you have a pet project you would like to see taken forward, or you have questions for any of the presenters, there will be ample opportunity to air your views.

I think it's worth mentioning that there will be another meeting once we have the results of our survey so we can share our findings and outline what we intend to put in the plan.

Allotment Musings....



The allotment site is a wonderful asset to the village. Visitors and newcomers are often amazed at what a beautiful area it is, home to a varied assortment of enthusiastic growers and opportunistic critters! I have visited a few allotment sites over the years and I think Gayton is my favourite. On most allotment sites the plots are individually fenced off but not here at Gayton, which makes it look like a one huge garden.

The site itself is only open to members of the Society but we do welcome potential new members, either Village Gardeners who might like to take advantage of the swop shop, BBQ, etc., or anyone interested in growing their own fruit and vegetables. To sow or not to sow, this is the question.....

I'm often asked at this time of year, *'have you sown anything yet?'* and the answer is nearly always yes, but every year I try not to sow too early and then invariably fail. As soon as a vaguely sunny day arrives, I'm down in my new shed sowing seeds that get lovingly tended indoors in the hope that the weather will warm up at some point.

I have been lucky enough to get a polytunnel, which is now in its second year, having survived the gales, which left one polytunnel in the hedge (not mine).

Last year in the polytunnel there were salad leaves, herbs, broad beans, spinach nearly all Winter, but this year has not been quite so successful. Every year is different and brings new challenges and surprises. It's always lovely to stop and chat with fellow growers and compare failures and successes, quite often learning some new tricks and tips as well as having a good laugh.

The soil at the allotment site is wonderful, being mainly iron stone, no clay, (unless you have a grandchild that likes digging to Australia) so it is good for growing anything and easy to dig. We attract growers from a lot of nearby villages because of the wonderful soil. And yet these pockets of iron stone soil are not as widespread as you might think. Someone at the end of Bugbrooke Road told me that their garden is clay and very hard to dig.



There are many ways to cultivate and such a variety of methods is visible on our allotment site: people who love to dig, rotovate, no-dig, raised beds, grass paths, no paths, meadows, flowers, ponds, orchards, all sorts of sheds and shacks and play areas!

This coming year we aim to hold the Annual Produce Show, a summer BBQ, and possibly a garden visit with lunch out. Who knows, I might win Biggest Caulie!!

Millennium Spinney



The Spinney Working Group had a second & very successful Hazel Coppicing Day at the end of November and this time I managed to rustle up a few more volunteers so it was not just Catherine & myself; we split into 2 groups and coppiced 2 more of our Hazel trees. By the end of the day, (and it was getting rather dark by the time we finished) we had some tired volunteers and 2 beautifully coppiced trees with their protective nests around them; we had harvested over 60 stakes and binders for the Canal & River Trust, some more thinner poles for the Allotmenteers and some firewood for the villagers.

The Canal & River Trust volunteers have recently been very busy hedge-laying along the Northampton Arm of the Grand Union Canal between Bridges No.4 & 5 using the stakes & binders coppiced from our Hazels.

Today I was hoping to catch the volunteers actually hedge-laying but they were busy shredding all the old branches they have cut from the hedge to rejuvenate it but I did get a photo of their most recent hedge-laying achievements. It was very nice to meet some of the volunteers who have been using the wood from our hazels to do the hedge-laying; and in return they were very pleased to hear there will be more Hazel available from our Millennium Spinney later in the year.



If they help us coppice the Hazels, we'll provide them with the stakes & binders they need for their hedge-laying.

So there will be more Coppicing Days to be arranged later in the year where you can come along and join in if you want to, or simply pop along and watch some traditional woodland management in your own local Spinney.

The Hibernaculum is looking good in the Spring sunshine. Our plan for the Hibernaculum over the next few weeks is to purchase & plant out lots of native wildflowers from Blisworth WildFlowers Nursery.



As the weather improves, there will no doubt be more jobs to do around the Spinney, spreading wood chippings to maintain the paths, clearing the ivy from the hazels & tidying up some of the fallen branches throughout the Spinney.

We did much better on a frozen day later in January, doing a quite long 5.6-mile walk over the low hills beside Pitsford Reservoir and back along the very icy perimeter path to Holcot for a chilly pint in the Swan.

For February's walk, I was asked to reign the distance in a bit, and a good sized group of us enjoyed the 3.6-mile loop from Little to Great Brington, along the Althorpe Coach Lane and then back over the tops to The Saracen's Head where some of the group enjoyed a light lunch. I enjoyed a pint of Timothy Taylor Boltmaker!



I was asked recently if Dogs and their owners were welcome on our walks and the answer is a definite Yes! Past and present members have dogs and as long as they socialise OK and they are on a lead when in animal pastures then they are very welcome.
