The village of Gayton is located in the centre of the parish on a high outcrop of Northamptonshire sandstone with extensive views, at the edge of the village, to the north-west towards the upper Nene Valley and to the north-east towards the western and southern suburbs of Northampton.

The village is well served; it has a church, a village hall, a school, a garage, a public house, an active Neighbourhood Watch scheme, daily newspaper delivery and a magazine, Gayton News, which is published four times a year.

Named after a local 19th century family (previously called the Squirrel), the Eykyn Arms has two main rooms, a lounge to the front of the pub and a bar/games room with a dartboard and Northants table skittles used by local teams; both rooms have a real fire. TNT & Sky Sports TV in both bars for sporting events. Quiz night on alternate Wednesdays. Food served Wednesday lunchtime to Saturday evening, & Breakfast served 9-11 on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays.

Broadband

Virtually the whole village is connected to the internet by traditional copper "telephone wires" back to a single cabinet at the junction of Back Lane and Blisworth Rd. From there, your choice of service is either Standard (ADSL) up to 24Mbps or Superfast Broadband (FTTC) up to 80Mbps. All Broadband companies use this same infrastructure, maintained by Openreach and therefore your choice of provider is purely influenced by Price and Service. Your actual speed is dependent on the length and quality of the copper connection to your house. Gigaclear are in the process of installing direct Fibre connections (FTTP) and this will be available in the near future.
